Our AYSO Plus program is still going strong and is an excellent chance for kids who demonstrate a keen interest in the sport to develop their skills and play more soccer under a more challenging, focused training environment.

We also continue to have a vibrant VIP program for kids with special needs. Our trainers and youth volunteers offer a safe and fun environment for kids of all ages.

Our Travel Experience

We are very excited to keep the ball rolling, as they say, next fall. Together with our CUSP partners at the Chappaqua Youth Soccer Club the "travel" experience begins for those going into 3rd grade. Everyone who wants more soccer will have a chance to play. Everyone who signs up will be assigned to a team and no one will be cut from this 3rd grade program. The teams will play in the Westchester Youth Soccer League (where travel teams play). This program, compared with some of the other out of town programs will also provide a fair, economical way for 3rd graders to have a travel experience.



Finally, remember you can play AYSO up until your graduation from Greeley! We have teams for everyone up to U19. In fact we have the strongest high school age program in the county with almost 80 players involved in our co-ed U16-U19 program. If you love playing soccer we will always be here to help you play.








03 2017-18 Season Wrap Up

We get our kids out there in the soccer fields to have fun as soon as we are able to sign them up in AYSO.

Then, after 5 or 6 years playing with their friends and against more friends, as all games in those age groups are within our town, the possibility of playing "travel" soccer shows up when they are in 4th grade.

A good number of our kids go on and try out for the different travel teams at that time. They provide the opportunity to play in a more competitive environment, and all games are played against teams from other towns, which adds to the excitement.

Unfortunately, many of the kids that do not make a travel team or prefer a more laid back recreational approach to soccer, end their love with the sport here.



Surprisingly, many of us parents do not realize that starting in 5th grade, all of our AYSO teams also play against teams in other towns, as travel teams do. The only difference may be the competitive level at which soccer is played under the two options.



In fact, such alternative is available until graduation! In the past few years, we have had between 70 and 80 high school kids playing AYSO every year.

Whether our children want to play competitively or recreationally, we should encourage them to keep doing so until they graduate from high school. It offers them an unmatched team effort experience which reaches its highest levels when they are about to leave home.


